HOW TO REGISTER

TO REGISTER AS AN INDIVIDUAL:

1. Select the two workshops you wish to attend – one morning workshop and one afternoon workshop.
2. Mail, fax, or deliver in person the Individual Registration Form (located on page 19) to your presbytery office, noting the deadlines shown below. **Checks should be made payable to your presbytery** (*Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, Cherokee Presbytery, or Northeast Georgia Presbytery*). If a form is faxed, a copy of the check should also be faxed. Checks should be received in your presbytery office within five business days. **[If you don't know to which presbytery you belong, ask your pastor, clerk of session, or a friend!]**
3. Registration Fee Schedule:

Registration received in your presbytery office by 2 p.m. on August 11 \$20

PLEASE NOTE: Registrations will NOT be processed August 12-21. Registrations received during that time will be held until the day of the event, at which time they will be processed as "walk-ins." The fee for "walk-ins" is much higher. Timely registrations will save you money!

TO REGISTER AS A CHURCH GROUP:

1. Select a coordinator to gather the necessary information and complete a Church Group Registration Form (located on pages 20-22).
To receive a group discount 10 or more participants from the same church must register at the same time. Remember that group registration forms MUST be received before 2 p.m., Tuesday, August 11, to qualify for a group discount.
2. The coordinator reviews the registration information of each member who wishes to participate, making sure that all names, workshops, and childcare information (if applicable) are correct, complete, and legible.
3. The coordinator arranges for a check to be drafted for the group, including childcare, if applicable. [See fees above.] **Please note: Checks should be made payable to YOUR presbytery** (*Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, Cherokee Presbytery, or Northeast Georgia Presbytery*). **[If you don't know to which presbytery you belong, ask your pastor, clerk of session, or a friend.]**

GROUP DISCOUNT

Only \$15 per person for any group with 10 or more (if paid by August 11).

[No discount for childcare --- see above for cost & details.]

Names of all those in the group, as well as workshop selections, **MUST** be sent in at the same time. In order to qualify for this discount, registrations **MUST** be RECEIVED in your presbytery office no later than 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, August 11. ***Group discounts will be given ONLY if the names and workshops of the individuals in the group are included when the registration is turned in.***

4. The coordinator mails, faxes, or delivers the registration form and checks to your presbytery office (*Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, Cherokee Presbytery, or Northeast Georgia Presbytery*) to be received by the deadline time and date of **2 p.m., Tuesday, August 11.** (See address below.) If the form is faxed, a copy of the check should also be faxed. Checks should be received in your presbytery office within five business days.
5. **Group discounts will not be given after August 11.** Instead, the individual “walk-in” registration fee of \$30 will be charged per person. *Timely registrations save money!*

From I-20 East or West:

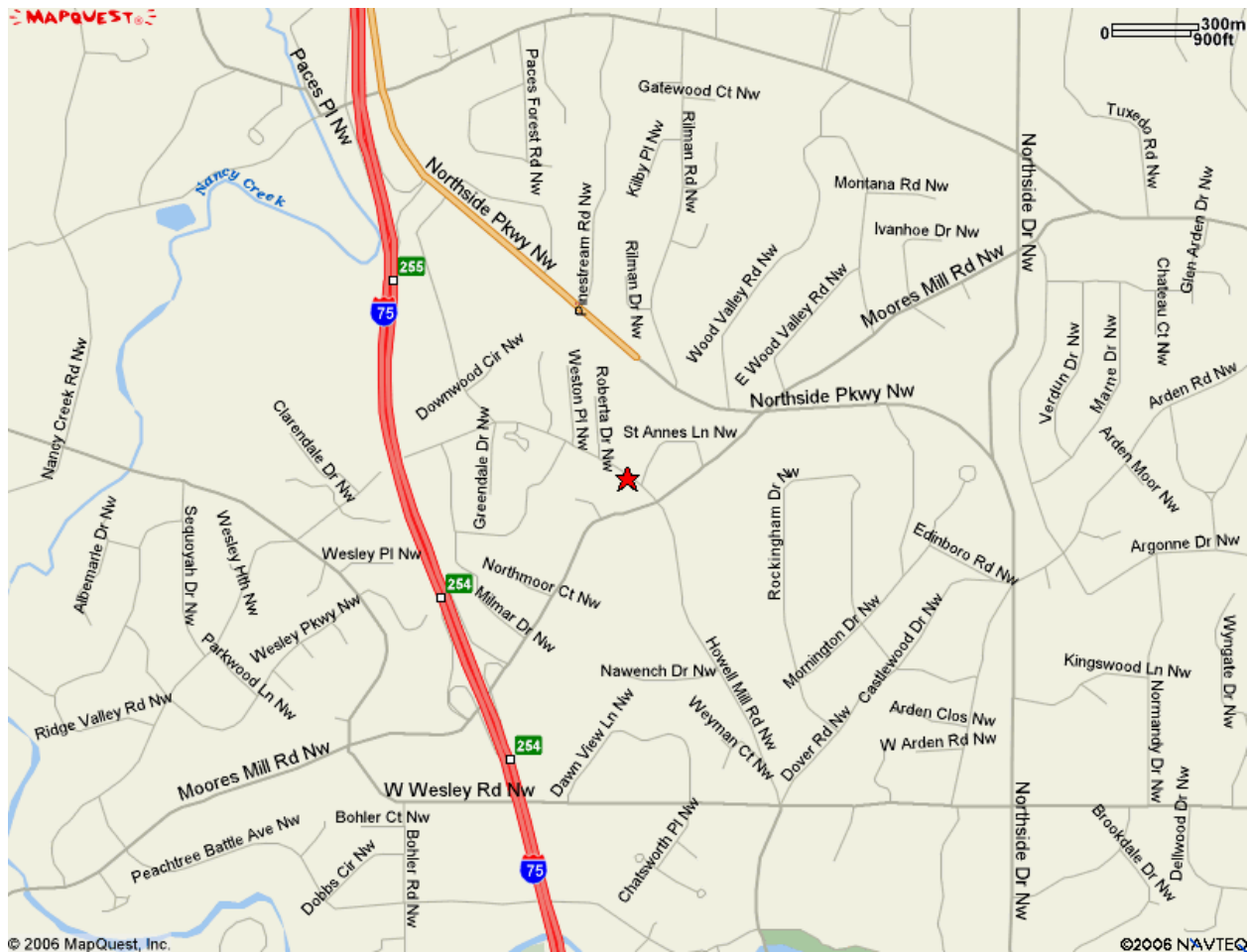
- Exit at I-75/85 North (Exit 57)

Parking

Childcare Details

Childcare for infants through 5th graders will be provided [*with advance reservations and an additional fee*] if a parent needs to bring his/her child to Trinity and has no other alternative. However, we would encourage parents to explore:

- Having the child stay at home with a relative or a babysitter
- Having the child stay with a sitter and other children from your church

Churches are encouraged to consider providing childcare for members attending this event.

If a parent wishes to bring a child to Trinity, loving, qualified childcare providers will be on hand for the day.

IF YOU NEED/WANT TO BRING A CHILD, PLEASE DO THE FOLLOWING AHEAD OF TIME:

1. Make a reservation for your child/children on your workshop registration form.
2. Indicate the number of children you are bringing, including names and ages.
3. **Send in your reservation no later than Tuesday, August 11.**
Trinity will hire childcare providers sufficient for the number of children who are pre-registered, so it is very important for them to have this information in advance in order to make the necessary arrangements.
4. **Include the childcare fee of \$15 per child** along with your registration form.
Checks should be made payable to YOUR presbytery office: *Presbytery of Greater Atlanta, Cherokee Presbytery, or Northeast Georgia Presbytery.* **[If you don't know to which presbytery you belong, ask your pastor, clerk of session, or a friend!]**
5. **Pack a lunch** for your child to assure he/she will have the food required or desired. Write the child's name on the sack/lunch box.
6. **Also**, pack any other necessities such as diapers, special toys, etc., labeling each with your child's name.

ONCE YOU ARRIVE AT TRINITY WITH YOUR CHILD:

1. ***Children who have been registered for childcare should be dropped off first. Please ask the parking lot attendants for directions and follow the signs to the childcare area.***

Be sure to give the childcare providers detailed instructions regarding your daughter and/or son.

2. Once your child has been checked-in, go to the registration area and complete your own registration process. Follow that by looking at displays, shopping in the bookstore, and visiting with friends.

MORNING (A.M.) CLASSES

A.M. 1 PRESCHOOLERS – THE SPIRITUAL JOURNEY BEGINS!

“Unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better. It's not.” Dr. Seuss, *The Lorax*. Those of us called to care for the education and nurture of our youngest learners are committed to making the start of this lifetime journey fun and memorable! Join me for conversation, activities, and curriculum with these young Christians in mind – because we care to make the journey better!

A.M. 2 THE THREE 'C'S' OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: THE CHILDREN, THE CLASSROOM, THE CURRICULUM

Presenter and participants will discuss how children 5-8 years old are alike and different developmentally, including spiritual development, and how to use the curriculum provided to encourage growth and development. They will consider ways in which classroom space can support the active learning style of early elementary children.

A.M. 3 OLDER ELEMENTARY KIDS 101 (GRADES 3, 4, 5)

Who are these fabulous creatures? What sorts of things are they interested and involved in and where does God come in? This basic course will focus on developmental stages, curriculum ideas, and service/mission projects for this exciting and challenging group of children. You'll also have a chance to share ideas with others and discover what have been their successes and misses.

A.M. 4 TEACHING MULTI-AGE CLASSES

This workshop will help you answer that basic question for your church. We'll explore how to set up and teach multi-age classes, look at activities that work with just one or two or so, and learn where to find multi-age curriculum resources or how to adapt other resources to make them work.
